AREA PARADISO

In " *Area Paradiso*", the video works by Angela Staffelbach, Daniela Müller and Valie Winter invite us to rediscover the territory of paradise in a bold and tender way.

"insomnia" deals with the various emotional states and visual perceptions of being awake and asleep, as well as all states in between. The video work shows the interplay between tension and relaxation, between reality, ecstasy and dreams and allows us to disappear into intermediate worlds.

The video work "the carrier bag" refers to Ursula K. Le Guin's text 'The Carrier Bag Theory of Fiction'. In this text, Le Guin advocates a new narrative style that can do without heroes by emphasising the value of collecting and storing, as well as the parallelism of (secondary) stories. Angela Staffelbach adapts the text and links it with her own associations and narrative strands.


"Make Jiq Leaves Transparent!" proposes an aesthetic intervention in that censorship is highlighted with shiny fetish-objects. Fig leaves that are usually employed to cover up "shameful" body parts are opaque in nature. For this installation, however, fig leaves were made transparent as well as reflective. The work is about in/visibility in general but specifically about the in/visibility of the diversity of sex and gender. A fluid plurality that is currently under attack - hence the depiction of war metaphors, for example a speer piercing a transparent fig leave or the depiction of a hermaphrodite who is raped by a satyr in the video. In our times, when Michelangelo Buonarroti's sculpture DAVID is censored, this piece is highly relevant.

The video installation "Problems" deals with female female* climbing. Bouldering - climbing on rocks in short sequences - has its origins in Fontainebleau near Paris, where the first hiking trails were also declared. These early appropriations of the Fontainebleau forest point the way to today's climbing gyms, where nature serves only as a functional reference. The climbing routes in bouldering are referred to as problems. Problems adds further readings to this: the title refers both to the ambivalence of human intervention in nature and to the challenges of female* climbing in opposition to colonially influenced notions of conquest. Rock and wall seem to serve as canvases on which the climbers project their problems and solutions. Daniela Müller wants to think of the rock and the climber as polymorphous collaborators who touch and shape each other.
